The management of groups should reflect the circumstances of the setting. The appropriate size of groups will depend on the age and overall number of children, and the layout of the setting. Children should be managed in groups up to 25 to 30 children. Children are not required to physically distance from each other, or from adults. Adults within an ELC setting should adhere to the correct social distancing rules, always, including outdoors. FA students should be based in a single group in Nursery to limit their interactions across groups Children with Additional Support Needs should be cared for in line with their Personal Plan. Consent for physical contact between staff and children to be sought for physical contact between staff and children/adults in situations such as drop off times, child safety and comforting. 						Adults in the setting in other circumstances should not need to wear face coverings as long as they can maintain 2m distancing. Should the prevalence of the virus in the population start rising schools may wish to encourage adults to wear face coverings as part of an enhanced system of approaches to reduce transmission. Impact of wearing face coverings on learners with additional support needs should be considered. Anyone (staff or pupil) who wishes to wear a face covering is free to do so, subject to Scot Gov / NHS / Aberdeenshire Council guidance / regulations

There is no need for additional PPE at meal and snack times. Ensure all FA students and staff are aware of food allergies and intolerances and support children with these. All rubbish and waste should be put straight in the bin by children/ staff (own)and not left for someone else to clear up. Staff should consider how they can safely maximise the use of their outdoor space. Staff and children should not share outdoor clothing.
